Share with your teacher and a small group, or the class, the reasons why the book motivated you to make a difference and what you did to help make the world a better place.



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

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


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**Tips for creating
an interesting oral
presentation:**

START your presentation with a prop, question, statistic, quote, piece of music, a guided visual imagery (imagine a paint a clear picture for your audience). Captivate your audience from the start.


PLAN – ensure you have a logical, well thought out discussion. Introduce the book. Provide a brief overview of the book without giving away too much – need to keep some mystery so your audience is inspired to read it. Share what you learnt and how this affected you. What did this make you wonder? How did this motivate you to take action? Explain what you did, where, how and the impact this has had on you and the community.

Use **PROPS** to support your discussion – maps, pictures, music, photos, anything that is relevant and would complement your discussion.
